THE MONTH IN CULTURE!

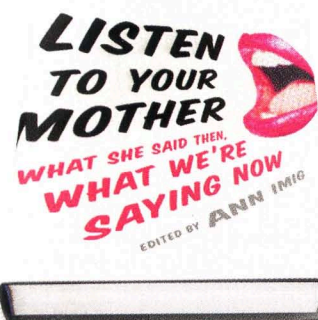

● April 12 Everyone's favorite angel-faced trash-talker, Amy Schumer, dishes out the golden popcorn at the MTV Movie Awards.

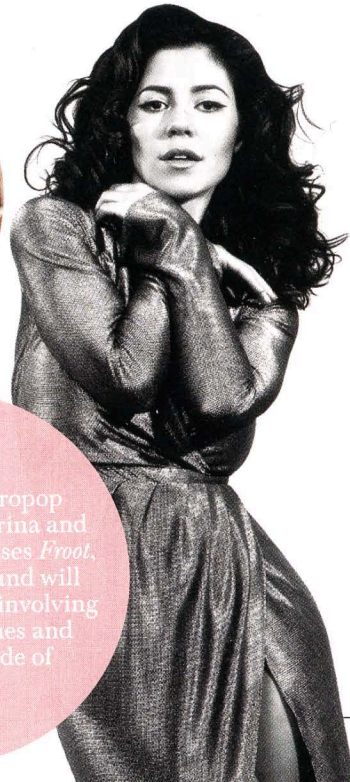
● April 13 Neutral Milk Hotel kick off what they swear is going to be their last tour, really.

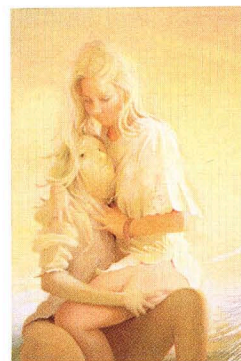
April 6
